

Tech Prep Articulation Agreement
Between
King's College
and
West Side Career Technology Center

Purpose

King's College is pleased to enter into this articulation agreement with West Side Career Technology Center with respect to its experientially based coursework and instruction in law enforcement. In this way a student will be able to use his/her secondary school experience as a basis for advanced placement for accepted students.

More specifically the purpose of this agreement is to formally provide the opportunity for students at West Side Career Technology Center who have successfully completed the Tech Prep Law Enforcement Program to pursue Associate or Bachelor's Degree studies in the Criminal Justice Program at King's College. After review of the syllabi, outcome goals and objectives and assessment associated with the Tech Prep Law Enforcement Program at West Side Career Technology Center, King's College is prepared to grant advanced placement standing to the program graduate who pursues the Associate Degree or Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice at King's College. The College may grant such graduates up to six (6) credits towards the degree. The King's College courses whose content parallel, in most respects, the coursework in the Tech Prep Law Enforcement Program at West Side Career Technology Center are **CJ110** (Introduction to the Criminal Justice System) and **CJ352** (Police Operations II). Therefore, credit may be awarded for one or both of the cited courses, but for no others listed among the requirements of the Criminal Justice curriculum.


Procedure


The process which Tech Prep Law Enforcement students must follow to earn King's College advanced placement credit is as follows:


1. The student will make formal application for admission to King's College and submit supporting materials requested for all admissions applicants.


2. The student will further:
 - A. Request in writing that the College Registrar grant advanced placement credit for his/her relevant Tech Prep coursework.
 - B. Attach a letter of support and evaluation of competency attainment from the instructor in Tech Prep Law Enforcement.
3. The Registrar will determine that the student is eligible for advanced placement because he/she has:
 - A. Completed all requirements of an approved Tech Prep Law Enforcement Program at West Side Career Technology Center.
 - B. Earned a grade of C (and/or the equivalent marking designation) or above in each law enforcement course with the Program.
 - C. Earned his/her high school diploma on schedule.
4. The Registrar will determine, in consultation, with the Criminal Justice Department Chairperson, the criminal justice course(s) for which credit will be given.
5. Such determination will be subject to the approval of the Vice President for Academic Affairs.
